Commissioner Packard to Board of Directors of the Clay County Youth Trust Fund and the Youth Service Council with a motion by Powell, seconded by Manning and carried. Commissioner Mockler to the Zoning Board with a motion by Powell, seconded by Packard and carried. Dr. Dendinger as County Health Officer with a motion by Powell, seconded by Passick and carried. Bruce Plate to Public Safety Board for a 3 year term expiring 12-31-17 with a motion by Passick, seconded by Manning and carried. Commissioner Powell and Highway Superintendent Polley to the Vermillion Basin Advisory Board with a motion by Passick, seconded by Packard and carried. Commissioner Passick as member to the Southeast Regional Detention Authority Steering Committee with a motion by Packard, seconded by Powell and carried. Commissioner Packard to the Joint Landfill Advisory Board with a motion by Passick, seconded by Manning and carried. Commissioner Manning to the VCDC with a motion by Powell, seconded by Passick and carried. Commissioner Manning to Vermillion Now Advisory Council with a motion by Powell, seconded by Passick and carried.

Powell moved, seconded by Passick and carried to designate the Vermillion Plain Talk as the official newspaper for the County and also The Equalizer at such time as it qualifies, but the County will begin to publish in The Equalizer immediately.

Passick moved, seconded by Packard and carried to designate the front door of the Courthouse and the front door of the Post Office in Wakonda be designated as places for holding foreclosure sales.

Powell moved, seconded by Passick and carried to designate First Bank & Trust, Bank of the West, CorTrust Bank/Vermillion, First Dakota National, Wells Fargo Bank/Vermillion, First Premier Bank/Wakonda, SD FIT, and Vermillion Federal Credit Union as the official depositories.

Pursuant to SDCL 28-17-4, Packard moved that on county burials the funeral director in charge shall furnish casket and outside container and conduct the funeral services in customary manner and the County shall allow the funeral director for merchandise and such services rendered a sum of \$1900 (complete costs) which includes vault and opening and closing of the grave. Motion seconded by Powell and carried.

Passick moved, seconded by Packard and carried to approve SD Public Assurance Alliance as the County's liability insurance and SDML for worker's compensation insurance.

Packard moved, seconded by Powell and carried to approve the agenda as presented.

Minutes of the January 6, 2015 meeting were approved with a motion by Passick, seconded by Manning and carried.

Jill Munger, Community Health/WIC Nurse, met with the Board to present the Quarterly Report. Munger reported that the WIC numbers held steady over the past quarter, although WIC numbers are down across the state. Clay County has about 250 active participants and about 300 total participants. Munger encourages WIC participants to be active because it is an educational program that teaches good nutrition. The office's immunizations have decreased, but the Vaccines for Children program could potentially bring in more patients if area clinics would choose not to participate. As of December 31, 2014, the office has given 1,282 flu vaccinations. The office currently has a caseload of about 21 pregnant women. The office will have 7-8 LPN students from Mount Marty College and approximately 3 BSN students from USD for job shadowing/interning.

Rod Polley, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to discuss Highway matters. The annual load limit letter was received from the State. If the County would choose not to participate in the State's load limit program, the State would take away funding. Polley advised the Commissioners to place load limits on County gravel roads as well as hard surface roads when the time comes to place limits this year. Passick moved, seconded by Packard and carried to authorize the Chairman to sign the letter.

Passick excused himself from the meeting at 9:13 a.m.

Polley presented the Board with maps of a 48 hour traffic count completed by the State. Traffic count is one component of how Polley prioritizes road repairs. He said there should be a new traffic count coming soon.

Polley also presented a 5 year chip sealing plan to the Board, which is only a maintenance and repair plan to protect what the County currently has for roads. Powell clarified that the overall 5 year plan is in compliance with what the State is proposing to require of counties who want to receive future funding. Manning asked what portion the yearly chip sealing plan covers of County roads. Polley said it is a 5-6 year process to do all the roads. Polley also said he estimates approximately a 10% increase in cost each year for chip sealing materials.

Polley reported that the Highway Department did move into the new Wakonda Highway Shop the last day of December. He invited the Board members to come tour the new building. Powell asked when the County last built a new building of any kind. Polley said it was around 1970.

Layne Stewart, Emergency Management Director, met with the Board to present the SLA Quarterly Activity Report for FY2015. Powell moved, seconded by Packard and carried to authorize the Chairman to sign the report. Stewart presented a report on personnel action that goes with the SLA Report. Powell moved, seconded by Packard and carried to authorize the Chairman to sign the report.

Stewart invited the Board to donate blood during the upcoming annual Heroes Behind the Badges blood drive on January 26, 2015.

Andy Howe, Sheriff, met with the Board to present jail meal bid specifications. Howe reported that bid specifications would be the same as last year. Powell moved, seconded by Packard and carried to advertise and set the bid opening for 9:15 a.m. January 27, 2015.

Shane and Allyson Hill, Tri-County News, met with the Board to discuss the legal newspaper status. They reported there is an office within Clay County. Philip Terwilliger, Deputy State's Attorney, said they would need to meet the statutory requirements just as any other newspaper. Manning asked how many subscribers the newspaper has. The Hills reported they have 250. Powell moved, seconded by Manning and carried to designate Tri-County News as a legal newspaper.

The Vermillion Public Library reports, the Register of Deeds monthly report, and the Sheriff's monthly reports were accepted and placed on file.

Uncollected property taxes were discussed, as it was a topic that the State Auditor reported on when he completed the audit. Teddi Gertsma, State's Attorney, and Cathi Powell, Treasurer, reported to the Board that the tax deed process is complex and time consuming, and they, along with the Register of Deeds Office, are working on it. About half of the 15 properties are currently under the tax deed process, and they will start the rest when those are complete.

The Board discussed the jail meal bids. Teddi Gertsma, State's Attorney, said that Robert's Rules of Order is not law, but rather a guidebook. Gertsma said she sees nothing wrong with the Board's actions regarding the jail meal bid situation. Andy Howe, Sheriff, said he spoke with the SD Department of Legislative Audit, and they told him the Board's actions were fair and proper. Gertsma pointed out the Board's proper actions saved the County over \$30,000.

He presented bid documentation from Lake County, Day County, and a national bid cooperative. James Morrison, Bethel Township Board, met with the Board to propose removal of a concrete box culvert and replacement with two corrugated culverts on 304 St. ½ mile east of 456 Ave. The suggestion was to either downsize to two 36" culverts or upsize to two 48" culverts. Polley discussed that there may be a bump in the road if 48" culverts were to be used. Powell moved, seconded by Packard and carried to authorize the highway department to replace the concrete culvert with two 36" inch culverts by any necessary means this year, and Bethel Township will assume responsibility of the culverts after the replacement.

The Board discussed the need to protect the road construction that has been completed in order to preserve taxpayer dollars. Polley said this is not a normal gravel road. It is not surface gravel. It is base course gravel that is put under asphalt. The option of lowering the speed limit to 30 mph instead of a weight limit was discussed. Hawley said it would be a fair option. Passick moved, seconded by Manning to adjust the resolution to a 30 mph speed limit, forego the weight limit resolution, and to pass and adopt the following Resolution #2015-16, A Resolution Setting Speed Limit on a Portion of Saginaw Avenue.
