

Clay County 4-H Guidelines

What a great and busy summer filled with 4-H events! Congratulations to everyone who participated in some way, either at the County or State Horse Show, Clay County Fair, State Dog Show, and the State Fair! We had some great exhibits thanks to all your hard work. And none of it would be possible without our fantastic volunteers and Colleen – make sure you take the time to thank them.

National 4-H Week is quickly coming up October 1 - 7, 2017. Start thinking about how you or your club can promote 4-H in your community, school, church, etc. If you need promotion supplies or materials, please contact the office. We are able to print several things from the National 4-H website.

During National 4-H Week will be the Fall Paper Clover Campaign at Tractor Supply. Dates for the fall campaign are Oct. 4 - 15, 2017. Tractor Supply helps raise money for 4-H programs through the sale of Paper Clovers in their stores by asking people to donate \$1 at checkout. Did you know that 90% of all funds raised go back to the state and county? If you are involved in a 4-H Club, consider participating in-store during the event to help increase fundraising dollars. It can be as simple as being in the store to ask customers to donate or setting up a promotional table - TSC would be happy to have anyone! Please let me know if you are interested in having a larger county time at the store.

IT'S TIME TO THINK ABOUT RECORD BOOKS AND JOURNALS

All books are due in the office by 5 pm on Monday, October 2. All award applications are also due that day. Check with your club leader as they may want them earlier in order to look over and still have them in the office by the deadline.

Awards you can apply for are Project Medals, Year Pins, Molly's Award (dog), Home Economics, Horse, Shooting Sports, Personal Development or Agriculture Sweepstakes, Farm Bureau, Dillon Jolley (TLC fees paid), County Achievement, County Citizenship, County Leadership, Overall Award, Key Award and Outstanding Horse. Please paper clip any award applications on the outside of the front cover.

First year members automatically receive their first year pin. You need to apply for year pins beginning with your second year. Some of the awards applications do have age and/or member year requirements.

If you don't know which awards you can apply for or have questions, call or email Colleen and she'll be happy to help you with the process.

As in previous years, no record book/journal turned in to office - no premium check from county fair.

NATIONAL 4-H YOUTH CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS by Emily Rolfes

In March, I attended the National 4-H Youth Conference in Washington, D.C. along with four other delegates from South Dakota. The conference had two parts: round tables and sightseeing. Each roundtable had about 18 people who came together to solve a problem given to us by different organizations. When I submitted the application, I had to rank 16 different round table options ranging from the use of wind-power to getting girls involved in STEM. I signed-up for emergency readiness, and in emergency readiness, we formulated a plan to better prepare and inform minorities such as the elderly, non-speaking English individuals, disabled, etc. of public health emergencies. After coming up with several ideas, we broke into teams to do more research and to make a presentation. We then took our presentation to the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response and presented the ideas we had come up with. After two and half intense days of coming up with solutions, we spent the remaining two days sightseeing. The entire conference did a night tour of the following monuments: World War II Memorial, Vietnam War Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Lincoln Monument, and Thomas Jefferson Monument. The following day's activities was up to the state delegation. South Dakota started the day off with sunrise coffee with Senator Thune, Senator Rounds, and Representative Noem. After coffee, we toured the capital building and had the privilege of sitting in the Senate session. From there, we saw the Library of Congress, the Botanical Gardens, the National Archives, and the National Museum of American History. On our last day, we had a late flight, so we spent the morning at the Holocaust Museum; while there we listened to a presentation given by a survivor of the Holocaust. It was a super busy week, but it was so much fun. It was a wonderful experience, and I would recommend this trip to anyone who asked.

NATIONAL 4-H VOLUNTEER e-FORUMS from Audrey Rider, Volunteer Development Field Specialist

This fall we have a wonderful opportunity to provide training to adult and youth 4-H Volunteers across the state through the National 4-H Volunteer e-Forum series! Three different sessions will be offered on October 5, November 2, and December 7, from 6-7:30 p.m. (CST). They will be offered at the 8 regional centers and Brookings. Everyone must RSVP two days prior to the event to make sure we will have enough participants and materials ready for each center. The workshops are free and will provide great resources to take back to their clubs.

During each session, virtual presenters will share content; host site facilitators (Extension staff and/or volunteers) will lead onsite, hands-on activities based on instructions provided; and adult and youth volunteers will interact with each other on-site and with volunteers from across the country via chat pods and poll questions. Resources will be provided for volunteers to use with the 4-H members in their clubs.

Topics to be discussed on each date are: October 5 – Cultivating an Environment for Growing True Leaders; November 2 – "STEM"ming into Animal Science, Growing True Leaders and December 7 – Helping 4-H'ers Grow in Life & Work.
