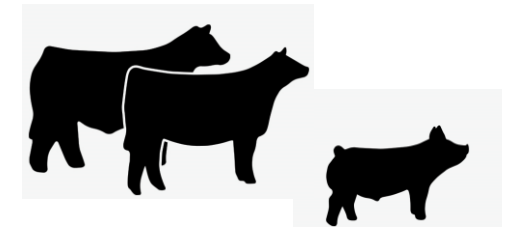

This show is open to all South Dakota 4-H members and all those who are eligible for Jr. Points Show. Points will be awarded for beef swine, and showmanship.

4-H ownership rules apply to the animals in the show.

Unethical grooming practices that change the appearance of the animals will not be permitted. Abusing animals in the show ring or in the barn preparing them for the show will not be tolerated. Violation of either rule can mean forfeiture of premiums and the member may be asked to leave the show. (See State 4-H Fair Book for unethical practices.) The committee will be checking for violations.

FITTING & GROOMING: The youth exhibitor must be present while washing, clipping, and fitting is being done and during the time the animal is in the Show Ring. Fitting is Optional. Animals will be fit at the discretion of the exhibitor.

Electricity is limited. Generators are highly recommended. If necessary, due to circuit overload, fans will be unplugged. Clippers and blowers take priority.

Livestock will be released at the conclusion of their show.

Camping is available at the Day County Fairgrounds for a fee of \$10 per night

All beef animals must be able to tie and lead. Animals that cause problems in the ring and endanger other members will be asked to leave the ring.

All decisions of the show committee, veterinarian, and the judges are final. All livestock must be removed from the barn within 1 hour after the show on Sunday.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

All animals must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) and shall have official identification listed on the CVI. Animals must be properly restrained to read official identification to avoid safety concerns for exhibitors and show staff.

All animals entered at the exhibition shall be free from evidence of all contagious diseases such as ringworm, parasites, pinkeye, lump jaw, abscesses, club lamb fungus, and warts. Each CVI must be issued by an accredited licensed vet, show name and address of exhibitor, show Highway 12 Round Up as destination, list each animal individually with official identification (tag, tattoo, 4-H tag, etc.)

ALL South Dakota Health Regulations will be followed.
