

ORDINANCE: #97-1

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE CLAY COUNTY TO OPT OUT OF SPECIFIC PORTIONS OF THE WASTE REDUCTION TARGET SCHEDULED TO BE EFFECTIVE: JANUARY 1, 1997 (ALL PRINTED PAPER PRODUCTS, CORRUGATED CARDBOARD OR OTHER CARDBOARD PAPER SHALL BE ELIMINATED FROM LANDFILL WASTE) AND JULY 1, 1997 (ALL CONTAINERS MADE FROM GLASS, PLASTIC, ALUMINUM, OR STEEL SHALL BE ELIMINATED FROM LANDFILL WASTE).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CLAY COUNTY that the Clay County having viewed and documented that the cost of recycling of: Deep Dyed Colored Paper to include Manila envelopes, Boxboard/Pressboard/similar light weight boxes, Contaminated paper materials, Glass containers, Plastic #3 , #4 , #5, #6, and #7, and Contaminated plastic, or metal container materials will cost more than the true and total cost of unsubsidized landfilling of Deep Dyed Colored Paper, Boxboard, Contaminated paper materials, Glass containers, Plastic #3 , #4 , #5, #6, and #7, and Contaminated containers materials and having followed the designated opt out procedure will be opting out of the specific portions of the waste reduction targets scheduled to go into effect January 1, 1997 and June 1, 1997. The Clay County will review its determination for this specific waste reduction targets at least once every two years starting with the effective date of this ordinance.

RESOLUTION #97-4  
CLAY COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Clay County desires to opt out of specific portions of the waste reduction targets scheduled to be effective: January 1, 1997 (*All printed paper products, corrugated cardboard or other cardboard paper shall be eliminated from landfill waste*) and July 1, 1997 (*All containers made from glass, plastic, aluminum, or steel shall be eliminated from landfill waste*); and

WHEREAS, the Clay County has hosted a public meeting and accepted comments on the reduction targets; and

WHEREAS, the Clay County has determined that recycling Deep Dyed Colored Paper to include Manila Envelopes, Boxboard, Pressboard and similar light weight boxes, Contaminated Paper Materials, Glass Containers, Plastic #3 , #4 , #5, #6, and #7, and Contaminated Containers Materials will cost more than the true and total cost of unsubsidized landfilling, including long-term costs of all options analyzed in the waste evaluation; and

WHEREAS, the Clay County will review this determination at least once every two years for these specific portions of the waste reduction targets; and


WHEREAS, the governing body of the Clay County is required by South Dakota law SDCL 34A-6-67, to pass a resolution as part of the opt out process:


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the Clay County opts out of the waste reduction target for:

<u>Implementation Date</u>	<u>Goal</u>
January 1, 1997	<i>All printed paper products, corrugated cardboard or other cardboard paper shall be eliminated from landfill waste.</i>
Opt Out of	Deep Dyed Colored Paper to include Manila Envelopes
Opt Out of	Boxboard, Pressboard and similar light weight boxes
Opt Out of	Contaminated recyclable paper materials.
July 1, 1997	<i>All container made from glass, plastic, aluminum, or steel shall be eliminated from landfill waste.</i>
Opt Out of	Glass containers
Opt Out of	Plastic #3 , #4 , #5, #6, and #7
Opt Out of	Contaminated recyclable containers materials.

CONTAMINATED RECYCLABLE means Recyclable materials that have residue of non recyclable product such as waste oil, food oils, wax, paint, plastic or thread coating or content in paper products of detectable coating or content establishing a non marketable material.
